

Centaurea Montana “Amethyst in Snow”



Flowers are reminiscent of the annual Bachelor’s Button, thus giving rise to its Common name “Perennial Bachelor’s Button.”

Lovely bicolor flowers have silky white, tubular petals radiating from royal purple centers from mid-May to mid June. It’s a striking new flower color for this familiar, sturdy perennial. Remove spent flowers to encourage repeat blooms. Silvery green foliage forms dense, substantial clumps. Unusual cut flower with moderate vase life. Hardy zone 3-9 with 2”flowers 12-16” height

Cyperus “Baby Tut”

Sun or partial shade, it is extremely fast growing. Cyperus are grass-like plants that must remain constantly wet. Plant them in pots, along the waters edge of a pond, or even in a pond. They will grow to a height of 24 inches. Treat them as an annual.
